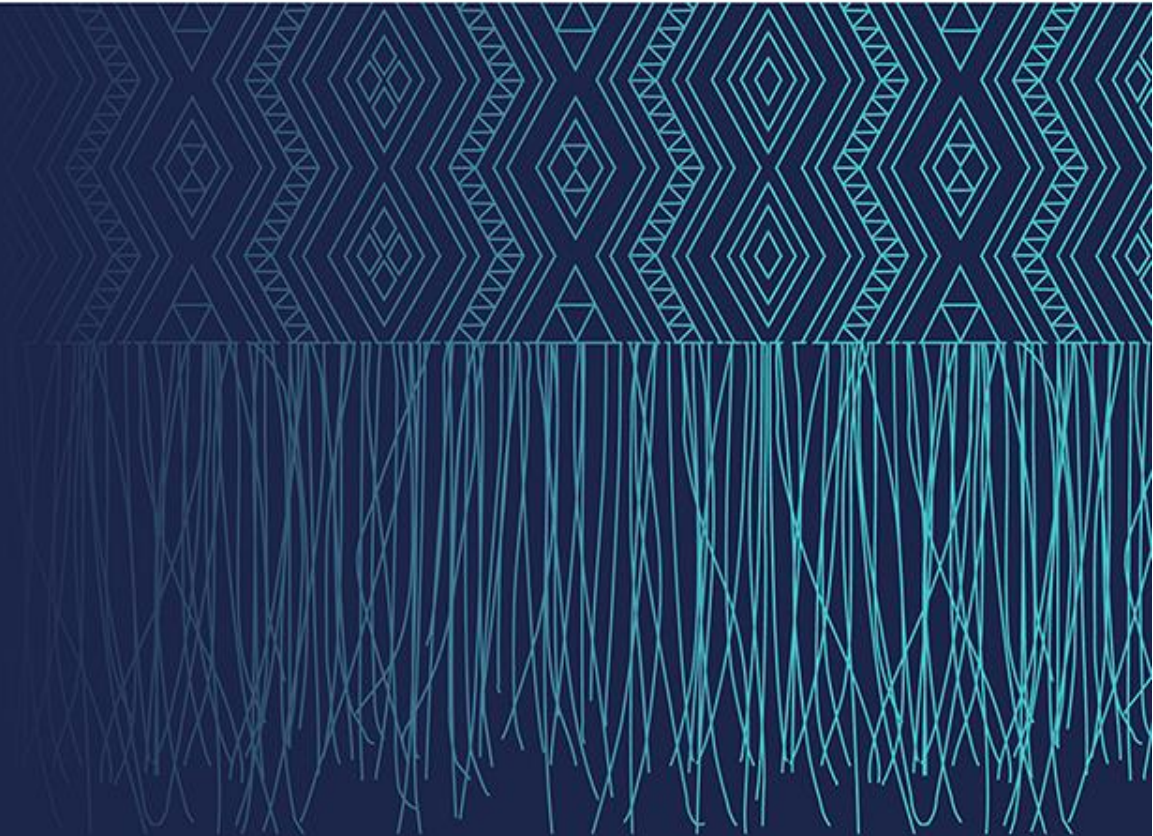

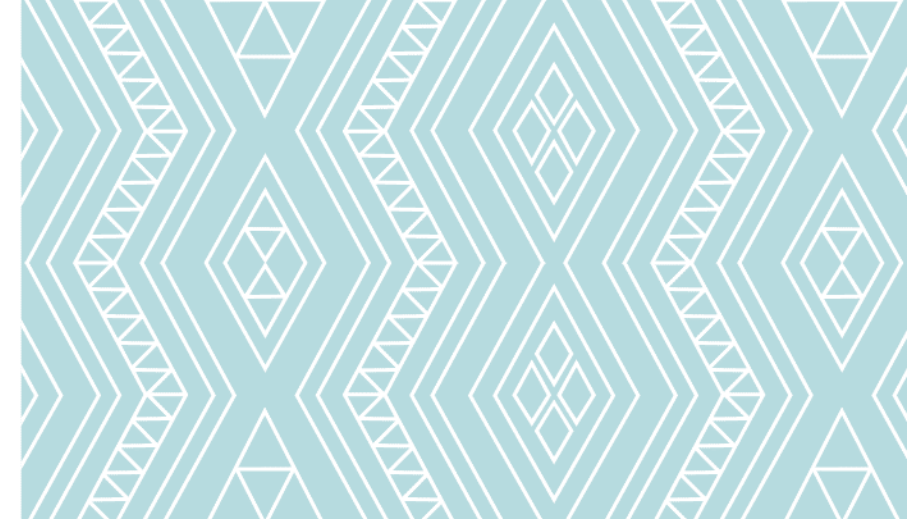


# National Initiatives Progress

# COVID-19 – public messages

- If you are unwell, stay away from friends and family at higher risk of getting very sick
- If you test positive for COVID-19, it is recommended you isolate for at least 5 days
- Antivirals are free for those who meet the criteria, to access antivirals, talk to your doctor, pharmacist or hauora provider
- Free face masks and rapid antigen tests (RATs) are still available from participating pharmacies and RAT collection sites

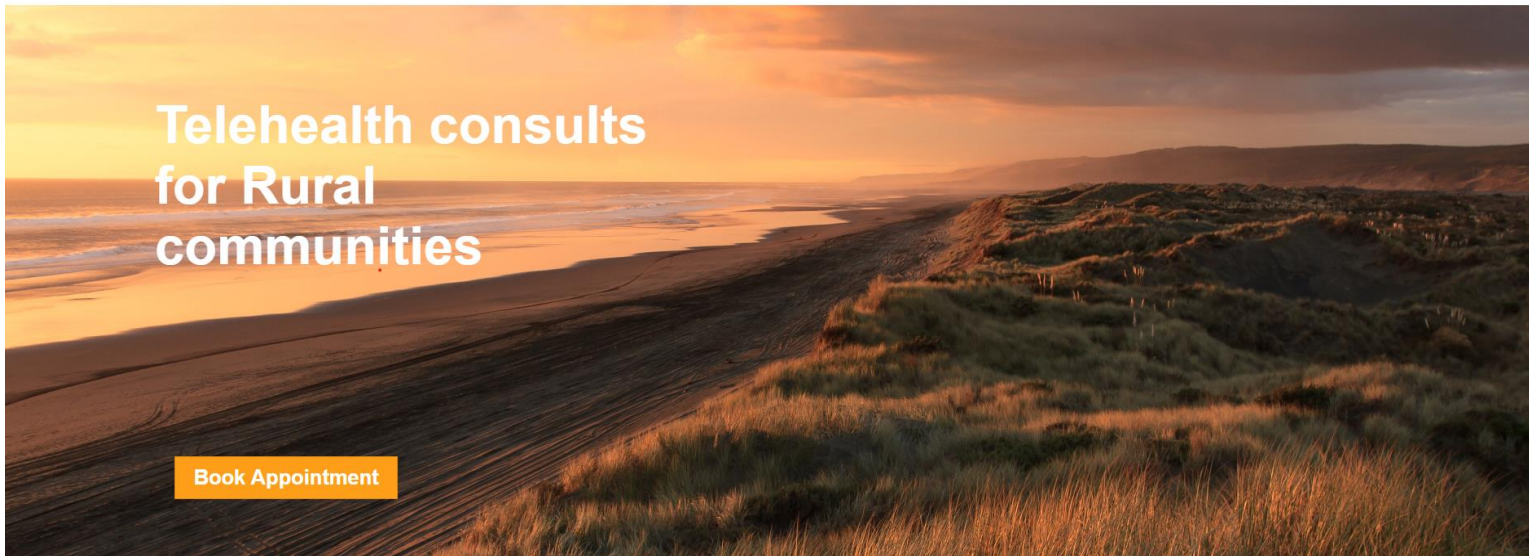

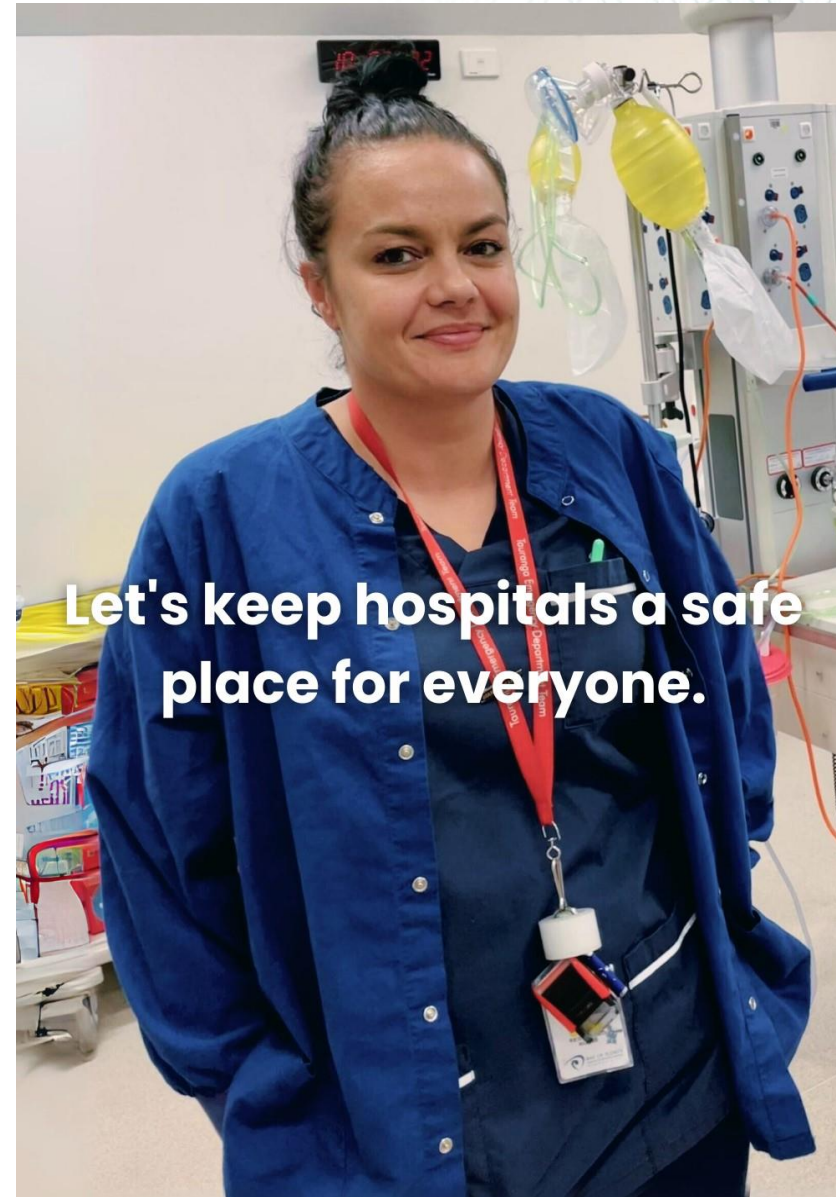

## Key objectives and progress

### Health System Decarbonisation

Goal: To reduce health system carbon emissions in line with a 1.5-degree scenario.

#### FOCUS AREAS:

Energy transition key objectives: 25% GHG reduction by 2025 | remove all coal boilers by 2025

- Coal boiler transition and Energy Transition Programme are both on track

Fleet transition key objective: transition fleet to low emission vehicles by 2025

- Still in initiate phase – longer than expected due to complexity, next step strategic programme business case

Understand impacts of and solutions for medical gases and vapours

- Business case for Nitrous Oxide destruction fixed plant pilot at Whangarei Hospital to be presented

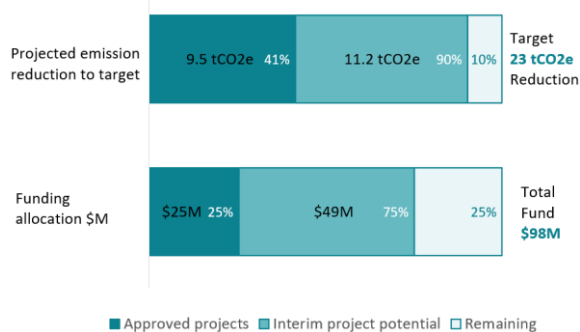
Fleet transition progress is slowed by operating in silos and infrastructure concerns alongside funding

Energy Transition Programme funding and emission reduction progress to target

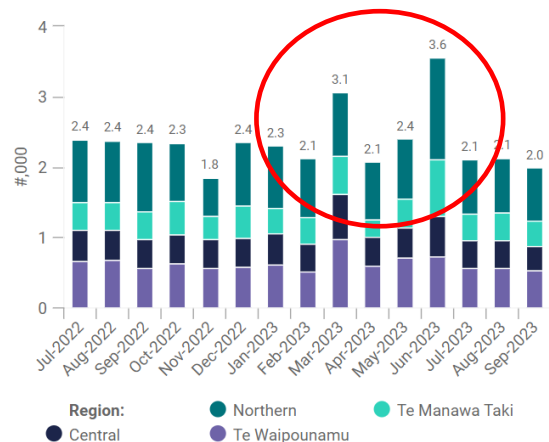


### Hospital sites using coal:



## Electricity

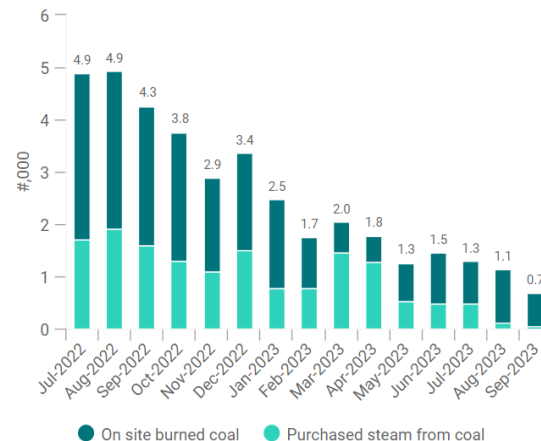
Electricity tCO2e



Note: peaks in consumption due to invoicing cycles, to be corrected when improved data is available

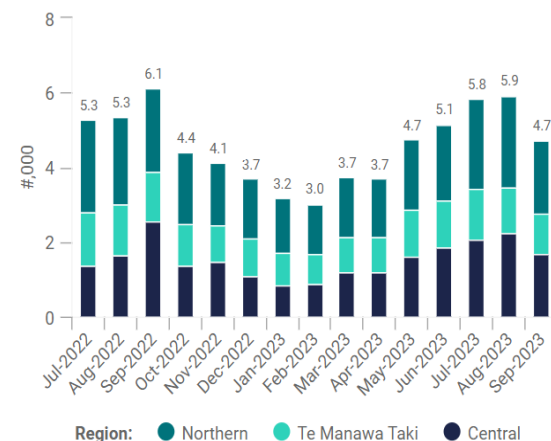
## Coal

Natural Gas tCO2e

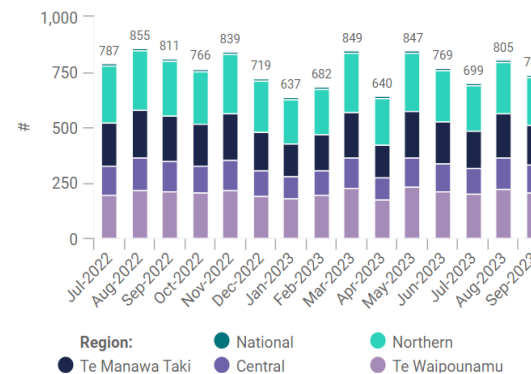

## Fleet Fuels

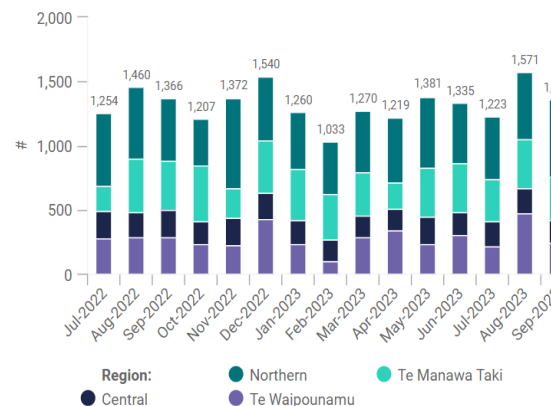
Fleet Fuels tCO2e
