Better immunisation coverage will reduce the risk of measles, pertussis (whooping cough), pneumonia, meningitis and other infectious diseases which can cause harm to children.



Shorter wait times will mean you receive your diagnosis, treatment, and progress through to a hospital bed (if needed) sooner.




