



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
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CADS Medically Managed Withdrawal Services

are for people with a physical dependence on alcohol or other drugs (e.g. opiates, benzodiazepines, methamphetamine) who require medical support to withdraw (detox) or to reduce their use or to stabilise on medications.

Physical dependence is when people:

- Need to increase how much they take to get the same effect
- Experience physical and psychological withdrawal symptoms when they stop drinking or using drugs

CADS provide medically managed withdrawal support through two services:

- The Community and Home Detox Service (CHDS) team can support you at home or in the community
- The in-patient unit is for people needing 24 hour medical supervision
