Tamariki NOT enrolled with CDS	<p>Tamariki may not be enrolled if they are;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> · new to Canterbury, · born before enrolment at birth process (May 2018) · not connected to a well child provider · parent/caregiver unsure of enrolment 	Whānau- contact CDS to enrol tamariki. APPOINTMENTS			
First Appointment	Most tamariki have their first dental check around 2 years old. Some tamariki are seen earlier.	CDS- send text asking whānau to book to an appointment Whānau- contact CDS to book this appointment	Community Dental Service 0800 846 983 or commdental@cdhb.health.nz
Appointments for tamariki	Tamariki have their teeth checked each year. This happens at a CDS Community Dental Clinic.	CDS- contact whānau when their child's due Whānau- are encouraged to update their contact details	Community Dental Service 0800 846 983 or commdental@cdhb.health.nz
Relief of Pain appointments	Available for tamariki experiencing pain.	Whānau- contact CDS to book appointment	Community Dental Service 0800 846 983 or commdental@cdhb.health.nz
Rescheduling appointment	Booked appointment time does not suit and needs to be changed.	Whānau- contact CDS to change appointment	Community Dental Service 0800 846 983 or commdental@cdhb.health.nz
Family appointment	Family appointments are available for whānau who have more than one child enrolled with the CDS.	Whānau- contact CDS and request a family appointment (tamariki only)	Community Dental Service 0800 846 983 or commdental@cdhb.health.nz
Missed appointment	Tamaiti was not brought to appointment.	CDS- contact whanau to rebook Whānau- contact CDS to rebook	Community Dental Service 0800 846 983 or commdental@cdhb.health.nz
Transport support for appointment	Transport support needed.	Whānau- request transport support when booking appointment	Community Dental Service 0800 846 983 or commdental@cdhb.health.nz
First tooth	A first tooth might appear around 5 months of age. Baby teeth are important. Start brushing as soon as teeth appear.	Whānau- brush tamariki's teeth, morning and night with fluoride toothpaste	
Tamariki at school	Tamariki at primary and intermediate school have their teeth checked in a dental van. Treatment will be completed in a Community Dental Clinic.	Whānau- contact CDS if details need updating.	Community Dental Service 0800 846 983 or commdental@cdhb.health.nz
Parent/caregiver with questions	Parent/caregiver has a question about their child's teeth or treatment they have received.	Whānau- are encouraged to update their contact details	Community Dental Service 0800 846 983 or commdental@cdhb.health.nz
