However, the clinical coding system we use to categorise the conditions for which someone receives hospital care do not always directly match the list you provided.

Item 12 - *coagulation disorder* included two of the later categories. As such, those later categories have not been included separately.

People hospitalised multiple times (transfers, readmissions, multiple incidents) are counted each time.

Please note that 2021 and 2022 data is provisional - this data has not undergone full quality assurance.
