Your request for Official information, reference: HNZ00026717

Thank you for your request made under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act) on 27 July 2023, asking for information relating to Dr Shane Reti's visits to emergency departments with St John's Ambulance. You specifically requested:

"... what information you hold relating to Dr Shane Reti's visits to emergency departments with St John's Ambulance earlier this year.

In particular, I would like this to cover any emails, messages, meeting notes or other information relating to conversations with

(a) St John's Ambulance and

(b) the Health Minister's office from Tuesday, July 11 onwards, when I first made a request for comment to Dr Verrall's media advisers.

Please also include copies of any other responses you have provided to OIA requests by others relating to Dr Reti's ambulance ride-alongs and visits to EDs.

Please also provide (a) a copy of your updated policy/procedures for observers (such as MPs) visiting EDs and (b) the policy as it read before this incident.

On 28 July 2023, you also asked:

"Can I please also add Wellington Free Ambulance to the organisations included in this OIA."

On 23 August 2023, Te Whatu Ora extended the time limit to respond to your request to 15 September 2023.

Te Whatu Ora has interpreted your request as any information received or sent by Te Whatu Ora and St John and Wellington Free Ambulance regarding Dr Reti's visits to emergency departments as an observer on ambulances.

Te Whatu Ora has made a reasonable endeavour to search for any information within the scope of your request. Information within scope of this request is itemised in Appendix 1 of this letter and copies of the documents are enclosed. Please note that we have scoped your request by searching through several business units including specific individuals to identify any information. The table in Appendix 1 outlines the grounds under which I have decided to withhold information. Where information is withheld under section 9 of the Act, I have considered the countervailing public interest in release in making this decision and consider that it does not outweigh the need to withhold at this time.

While submitted outside of the date of the request, for completeness and to provide reasonable assistance, Te Whatu Ora is providing a copy of the letter to Wellington Free Ambulance dated 2 August 2023 regarding visitors to Te Whatu Ora facilities.

Each hospital has individual visitor policies. As such, part of your request is refused under section 18(e) of the Act, as there is no Te Whatu Ora formal policy or procedure for observers visiting emergency departments. Te Whatu Ora frequently provides other advice, but that is specific to the event/visit as required.



Kia ora Sophie

There has been recent media comment re MP visits to EDs via ambulance services, which Andrew and I have looked into – and will seek to be tighter on across comms and government services ahead.

This has alerted us to those services providers (as 3rd party providers) not connecting with us, or advising us, on those visits.

We are now in the process of resetting expectations with the providers; it is important we are aware and, in at least some cases, jointly determining whether or not MPs are approved for visits and to witness patient care. There are important issues to consider like health and safety, and impact on flow management; as well as briefing staff.

Where we do know, management action or plans are typically put in place. We did do this for a visit for Dr Reti to Lakes hospital in the recent past, where it was agreed and recorded that he could not enter ED. It is possible our local sites had more visibility than us, and local plans in place, which we have not bottomed out. We will be resetting internal expectations on this as well.

To give us some visibility, St John (attached) and Wellington Free (below) have provided us information. Although they are NGO providers and there are forms people sign to be able to do ambulance 'ride along', which includes confidentiality and health and safety, the frequency of taking visitors (particularly St John) onto Te Whatu Ora premises is not acceptable and we will be following up with the providers.

Usual protocol is for them to notify us via NASO (along with Te Whatu Ora comms/media and ACC comms/media). This did not occur for the instances listed. Both providers have been reminded about the proper protocols they should have followed to notify us beforehand.



Please see below a media enquiry and response re ED visits by MPs.

REQUEST From: Alex Spence, NZ Herald

I've done an interview with Shane Reti, National's health spokerson, about problems in the emergency medicine system, and I just want to check some facts please.

Reti says he shadowed ambulances on late shifts for three months earlier this year. Between Waitangi Day and Easter, Reti says he spent most Friday or Saturday nights riding along with St John's Ambulance crews. In three months he did ride-alongs in all 20 former district health boards. (I am checking this with St John's ambulance).

Reti says he went into people's homes and also accompanied patients in ambulances to EDs in all the 20 DHBs. At one ED, Waikato, in March, they were "ramped" for more than an hour. That night, there were 10 ambulances for the entire Waikato region and at one point half of them were waiting at the ED to offload patients.

Can you get someone please to confirm that that is correct to the best of Te Whatu Ora's information?





Visitors to Te Whatu Ora facilities

Further to recent discussions on this matter, we want to formalise our requirement that standard protocols are followed for visitors not directly involved in or associated with care when visiting working parts of Te Whatu Ora facilities.

Before going further, I want to underscore that visitors directly associated with care, particularly a patient's whānau, absolutely play an important part in the care journey, and can have good reason to enter Te Whatu Ora facilities through your own services. We recognise their important role and interests.

For the purpose of this letter, we are referring to 'discretionary visitors', where the individuals are not directly involved in or associated with care or where the visits are not strictly necessary for the effective delivery of health services.

Discretionary visitors came to our attention recently in the context of visits by Members of Parliament; however we emphasise that the issues and considerations are general in nature and apply to all discretionary visitors. Even for Te Whatu Ora itself, there are strict protocols in place for visits that apply to everyone, at all levels of our organisation.

In terms of our partnership, there are strong reasons why we need you to provide advance notice of proposed discretionary visitors. Te Whatu Ora requires this to consider any impact on patient care and any health, safety, security and integrity considerations. Te Whatu Ora also needs to properly inform staff, and to be able to brief visitors on expectations and protocols. In terms of patient care, because the visits aren't strictly necessary, there is also the risk that – if not appropriately managed – they could compromise service delivery. This is a risk we absolutely need to avoid as we're sure you would appreciate.

While a separate matter to access to Te Whatu Ora facilities, we are also keen to further understand how you consider the interests of patients (many of whom will be compromised in their ability to share their view) when agreeing to other people observing their care.

In our view these are all appropriate considerations for Te Whatu Ora as both an owner/manager of facilities and given the legal responsibilities we hold for delivering health services. More broadly, it has also been a long-standing expectation that, if you are undertaking activity that is likely to draw media intention or bring risk to Te Whatu Ora or ACC, we are made aware in advance. While not your intention, your approach, as we understand it from recent events, has not had sufficient regard for these core interests.

On the basis of the above, there is a clear need for you to proactively advise Te Whatu Ora of proposals for discretionary visitors, allowing us sufficient time to consider the issues and interests summarised. We would be pleased to work with you on refining an approach that works for us both. Furthermore, we absolutely want an approach whereby discretionary visitors can, for

appropriate reasons, visit Te Whatu Ora facilities. This includes the important role of visits in building knowledge and awareness of how the health system works.

In the case of Members of Parliament, we must also consider additional expectations related to serving the Government of the day and acting with integrity and political neutrality. In particular, it is a generally accepted practice that, if an MP wishes to visit a public service facility, engagement with the agency's chief executive or the responsible Minister is first required. As a service provider operating closely alongside us, this context is also particularly relevant to you. As a funder, we must have confidence you have robust processes in place to ensure integrity and political neutrality in your operations.



Visitors to Te Whatu Ora facilities

Further to recent discussions on this matter with your team, we want to formalise our requirement that standard protocols are followed for visitors not directly involved in or associated with care when visiting working parts of Te Whatu Ora facilities.

Before going further, I want to underscore that visitors directly associated with care, particularly a patient's whānau, absolutely play an important part in the care journey, and can have good reason to enter Te Whatu Ora facilities through your own services. We recognise their important role and interests.

For the purpose of this letter, we are referring to 'discretionary visitors', where the individuals are not directly involved in or associated with care or where the visits are not strictly necessary for the effective delivery of health services.

Discretionary visitors came to our attention recently in the context of visits by Members of Parliament; however we emphasise that the issues and considerations are general in nature and apply to all discretionary visitors. Even for Te Whatu Ora itself, there are strict protocols in place for visits that apply to everyone, at all levels of our organisation.

In terms of our partnership, there are strong reasons why we need you to provide advance notice of proposed discretionary visitors. Te Whatu Ora requires this to consider any impact on patient care and any health, safety, security and integrity considerations. Te Whatu Ora also needs to properly inform staff, and to be able to brief visitors on expectations and protocols. In terms of patient care, because the visits aren't strictly necessary, there is also the risk that – if not appropriately managed – they could compromise service delivery. This is a risk we absolutely need to avoid as we're sure you would appreciate.
