The Reimbursement Training Lists have been developed by the DHBs and SToNZ to provide a guide on appropriate and relevant expenses that facilitate acceptance on to a training programme, or are requirements for completion of vocational training. The development process included input from the specialty colleges, DHB training committees, college supervisors and trainee representatives. These lists are not exhaustive and RMOs can seek reimbursement for items that are not on the lists provided:

The item is a requirement of training, or an application prerequisite set by the relevant Speciality College; or
Where the item is not a requirement of training or an application prerequisite, it must be considered generally relevant and beneficial to relevant RMOs towards completion of the vocational pathway

Endorsed for reimbursement by the appropriate clinical lead

College and exam fees required to obtain a New Zealand or Australasian vocational scope of practice will be reimbursed as detailed in Clauses 10.3 and 10.6.2.
