

Surgery

The Reimbursement Training Lists have been developed by the DHBs and STONZ to provide a guide on appropriate and relevant expenses that facilitate acceptance on to a training programme, or are requirements for completion of vocational training. The development process included input from the specialty colleges, DHB training committees, college supervisors and trainee representatives. These lists are not exhaustive and RMOs can seek reimbursement for items that are not on the lists provided:

The item is a requirement of training, or an application prerequisite set by the relevant Speciality College; or
Where the item is not a requirement of training or an application prerequisite, it must be considered generally relevant and beneficial to relevant RMOs towards completion of the vocational pathway

Endorsed for reimbursement by the appropriate clinical lead

Refer to clause 10 Employment Related Expenses of the DHB & STONZ National Manual for information on when the lists will be reviewed and how to request an item be added or removed.

College and exam fees required to obtain a New Zealand or Australasian vocational scope of practice will be reimbursed as detailed in Clauses 10.3 and 10.6.2.

- Scoring only includes presentations and posters at scientific meetings or conferences subject to peer reviewed abstract selection.
 - Hospital based presentations will not be scored.

- Professional development activities specifically aimed at assisting doctors prepare for the GSSE and the CE
- Activities that are less than 3 hours in duration (excluding refreshment breaks).
- Attendance at hospital grand rounds, morbidity meetings, unit audits or other such expected activities as part of employment
- Activities that will be attended in the future (i.e. after the application closing date).

Professional Development Activities (Non-Medical/Non-Technical) (maximum 15 points):

- Scoring considers conferences, workshops, seminars or courses where the content has relevance to Professionalism, Scholar/Teacher, Health Advocacy, Management and Leadership, Collaboration and Communication, as determined by the Board
- Points will be awarded for attendance at conferences, meetings or courses (whether delivered face to face or virtually).

Points will not be awarded for:

- Workshops or courses that form part of a meeting/conference where a score has already been given for attendance at the meeting/conference, unless the workshop or course attracts its own CPD points
- Activities that are less than 3 hours in duration (excluding refreshment breaks)
- Attendance at hospital grand rounds, morbidity meetings, unit audits or other such expected activities as part of employment
- Activities that will be attended in the future (i.e. after the application closing date)
- Involvement in continued teaching or teaching of medical students or interns or similar

Presentations (maximum 20 points):

Points will be awarded for:

- Oral presentations (including moderated poster presentations comprising an oral component) personally delivered by the applicant, provided the applicant is the first or second author
- Unmoderated poster presentations (i.e. poster is on display in exhibition area only) where the applicant is the first author and the named presenter in the meeting program
- Scoring of presentations will be weighted depending on the type of meeting

Points will not be awarded for poster presentations at meetings of a Regional or Sectional organisation.
