

Te Whatu Ora Workforce Development Funding For Nurses Working in Primary Care and the Community

The Funding

Health New Zealand / Te Whatu Ora are providing funding for postgraduate nursing study to support nurses interested in RN Prescribing and NP pathways who work in the community. Funding will cover one 30-credit postgraduate nursing course per student, in Semester 2, 2024.

This funding **does not cover** travel, accommodation, textbooks, equipment, meals, or release time. Applicants can work with their employer to access workforce development enablement funding which has been provided at a regional level to support equity of access and to enable the primary and community care workforce to take up these opportunities.

Who can apply?

Registered Nurses employed in the primary and community health workforce (i.e. employed by PHOs, GP practices, Hauora Māori and Pacific community providers, or aged care providers) are eligible to apply for this funding opportunity.

Massey University Semester 2 Courses

All courses are 30-credits, completed in one semester, and **fully online**, except 168728 and 168750. Applicants need to be enrolled in either Postgraduate Certificate in Nursing, Postgraduate Diploma in Nursing, or Master in Nursing programmes.
